



Sustainability *Planning* Workshops

- **Purpose:** To assist States in developing Sustainability goals, objectives, and action plans to support their Adjutant General's (TAG's) priorities.
- **Who attends:** The TAG, Joint and G-staff, Directors, Commands, others as required by the TAG.
- **How:** An internal even kicked- off by the TAG with senior leadership and Directorates, followed by half-day Sustainability awareness training and half-day workshops with individual teams to begin developing Sustainability goals/action plans.
- **Why:** To incorporate Sustainability goals/objectives into States' strategic plans; identify additional stakeholders and partnership opportunities for leveraging resources; support the TAG's priorities.

Purpose

Establish mutually beneficial partnerships that support the Guard's focus on maintaining availability of land, air, and water necessary to train, operate and successfully execute our missions now and in the future.



Sustainability *Partnering* Workshops

Who Attends

The Adjutant General, Joint and G-staff, Directors, State Congressional delegation, state/local agencies, NGOs, industry, local community leaders and stakeholders, in addition to NGB Sustainability Team.



Sustainability *Partnering* Workshops

What

The workshop structure includes development of teams that cross multiple lines of operation, including Materiel, Readiness, and Services & Infrastructure.



Sustainability *Partnering* Workshops

How

Kick-off by The Adjutant General with senior leadership and Directorates, followed by breakout sessions with individual teams to identify common sustainability goals/challenges, and where partnerships may help all of us become a more sustainable community.


Why
